

# California Incident Command Certification System

## Orange County Operational Area

CICCS delegates to the local fire chief of an organized fire department the authorization to determine that an individual meets the certification requirements for the ICS 100 and 200 level positions listed below:

- Incident Commander Type 4 (ICT-4)
- Staging Area Manager
- Display Processor
- Security Manager
- Base Camp Manager
- Receiving and Distribution Manager
- Claims Manager
- Field Observer
- Status Check-In Recorder
- Incident Communications Manager
- Ordering Manager
- Equipment Manager
- Helicopter Manager
- Firefighter (I and II)
- Apparatus (Engine) Operator
- Engine Boss

Application Process:

An individual applying for the position certification shall submit to their agency chief (or designee) the following documents:

- Course Completion Certificates (curriculum and instructor must follow minimum requirements following NWCG PMS-310-1 and the Field Managers Course Guide).
- Completed Position Task Book
- Copies of ICS Form 225 (Incident Evaluation) from Trainee Assignments

The Fire Chief or designee reviews the application, course completion certificates, and the Position Task Book to determine if the employee meets the established minimum standards set for by CICCS. Once this process is completed, the fire chief may determine that this employee is certified to perform the ICS position. The Chief then signs a CICCS certificate.

**The decision whether this individual meets the physical fitness and currency requirements of CICCS (NWCG PMS 310-1) and is qualified to hold the any ICS position within the state mutual aid system rests with the home agency fire chief**
